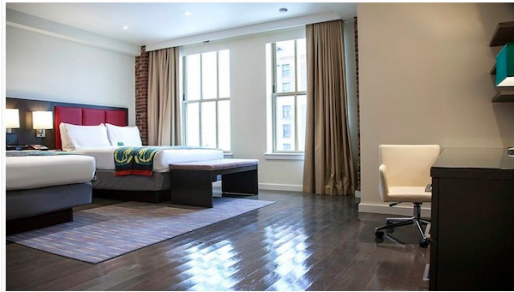




Hotel Indigo Has Landed in Newark

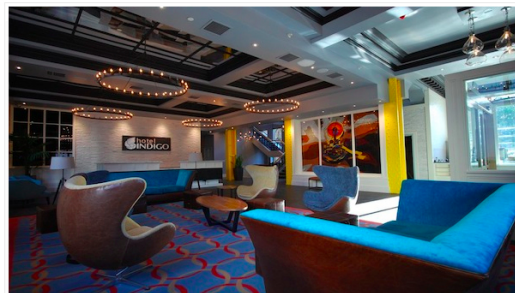


Just over two years ago, Newark got its first new hotel in four decades. And it looks like the fever is catching, because **Hotel Indigo** has just opened up in downtown Newark, making it the third in the New York area.

The theme is "modern industry" (tanneries, breweries and innovators hung around here in the 19th century), so there's a mosaic tiled ticker tape (Thomas Edison's invention) in the lobby, a bank vault-turned pizza oven in the restaurant, ALVA, and exposed brick walls in the bedrooms, giving it that authentic industrial vibe (the building itself is from 1912).



Local and seasonal is the name of the game at both ALVA (above) and the inhouse café – so much so, in fact, that even the coffee is made by 145-year-old local brand, TM Ward. Manhattan views? None from the rooms, as far as we can tell, but you can get them from Skylab, the rooftop bar (the only one of its kind in downtown Newark, according to the hotel).
